State of the College Webinar

Dean Sarker opened the meeting by presenting an overview of an exciting webinar event scheduled for September 23, 2024. The Dean noted that during her first year at Pamplin, she met with a number of advisory boards, generally presenting the same message to each board. Considering the large number of Pamplin advisory boards that exist today, the Dean feels like there would be a big challenge trying to get her message out to all boards with an in-person

attendance at each board meeting. The State of the College webinar event is designed to offer an opportunity for all advisory board members to hear the dean's message at one time and to engage with Q & A as well.

The Dean expressed the desire to present a uniform, consistent message through the #OnePamplin theme. She stated that since the PCLE is the face of the program through which she will deliver the State of the College address. Then gave a brief overview of what she plans to cover in her State of the College Address. The key topics that she plans on covering are:

- Looking back over her first year as Pamplin Dean and what she learned.
- Next Gen Pamplin and the Dean's vision
- #One Pamplin, including creation of the new Office of Transformation
- Resources, especially giving Day Success
- Reputation- Reporting on current rankings and efforts to increase rankings. Success stories of faculty and students.

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• Looking to the upcoming year 2024-2025: Strategic Planning update, the new building design and other plans.

With these key themes in mind PCLE meeting participants formed small groups to develop potential questions for the Q & A segment of the webinar. After ideating for a period of time, each of the groups reported out on the questions that were developed. Great suggestions were put forth and final list of seven questions were selected and posed to the Dean during the webinar.

Michelle noted that she works collaboratively with Associate Deans Reza Barkhi, Strategic and Global Initiatives and Innovation and Rajesh Bagchi, Research, Graduate Programs and Centers in order to help implement the Dean's vision for Pamplin.

- Transformational experiences
- Giving every student a chance to study abroad, or if not, an alternate global experience
- A chance for every student to have at least one internship
- Experiential learning opportunities in the curriculum

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A faculty teaching workshop has been established is discussing how to use AI in the classroom and how to train students to have AI skills. Also, how to have service-learning projects that reach out to communities and programs working with corporate partners.

Pamplin has three Living Learning Communities which expand the student experience among students with shared interests beyond the classroom.

Innovate- Entrepreneurship

Impact- Data Analytics

Securitas- Cybersecurity

With the establishment of a college task force focused on data analytics, Emily McCorkle is focusing on undergraduate analytics, in order to have data driven decision making at the college level, gathering data on topics such as:

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- How often do students switch majors?
- When does a student switch a major?
- What are the most common double majors?
- In which courses are students struggling?
- What college initiatives help students improve their grades?


Michelle then introduced Bennett Kawas, President of the Dean's Advisory Board of Students (DABS), noting that DABS has been set up to be the PCLE of the student body, so that students can learn how to be active alumni.

Bennett presented the current DABS reformed and restructured organization which has been revised and expanded to better reflect its mission to be a group of students who promote collaboration and leadership among student organizations and advisory boards, much like the PCLE. DABS acts as the voice of the students to Pamplin leadership as well as alumni.

DABS Organization Structure-

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• Stephen Cronin, External Affairs

Stephen works with department student advisory board chairs, faculty committee student reps, BOV undergraduate student rep and Pamplin student senators.

• Lauren Stewart, Internal Affairs

Lauren is responsible for supporting the development of curricular and co-curricular experiences, the business lab, certificate programs, alumni partnerships, PAC student engagement events, alumni mentoring and the student organization fund.

• Nick Mariano, Marketing and Operations

Nick leads DABS support of student engagement, the student org coalition, and community events. He also leads DABS marketing initiatives working with Prism and DEIB.

The bulk of DABS members sit on one of three committees; Student Engagement, Curricular and Co-curricular experiences and Alumni Partnerships. The Student Engagement Committee focuses on bringing together all of the student organizations, sponsoring community events and keeping students engaged. The Curricular and Co-curricular Committee worked with the Business Lab, and has now transitioned to working with the similar Pamplin Pro concept to develop the new courses. This committee also ideates around certificate programs, which help improve students chances of getting a higher-level job and being more sought after by employers and helping determine what certificate programs matter.

The third DABS committee is Alumni Partnerships. This committee functions with three sub-committees: the PAC student experience community events, which focuses on developing alumni connections; the alumni mentoring sub-committee and finally the student organization fund sub-committee. The student org fund was established last year to help raise funds to enable the various student orgs to have funds to support their projects and initiatives.

Emily McCorkle, Director of Undergraduate Analytics and Student Engagement discussed a newly developed college wide initiative to support and promote student mentoring on a broader scale. The concept was introduced at the Pamplin Engagement Summit last April and further developed over the Summer. The mentorship initiative has been taking a look at where we are as a college, which advisory boards need or would like mentorship. Also, Emily is working with DABS, looking at current college programs, identifying needs and opportunities to develop mentoring programs. The goal is to strengthen the role and effectiveness of advisory boards in supporting mentorship. **PCLE members can help identify mentoring needs and opportunities through their boards.**
