To complete the International Business: Southeast Asia Minor students must complete the **18 hours of required and elective classes** listed in numbers 1, 2, and 3 below with an average of 2.0 in these courses AND satisfy the foreign language and international experience requirements listed in numbers 4 and 5 below. **No course grade may be lower than a C- to earn the minor.** Only 9 credits in the minor may double count with degree requirements. You may not pursue both the International Business Minor (IB) and the International Business: Southeast Asia Minor (IBSA). The minor will be noted on the student's transcript.
